From VP Paul Kowalczyk

I had the opportunity to attend the National Association of State Energy Officials (NASEO) conference in Washington D.C. a few weeks ago. This conference focused on energy code training, compliance and enforcement. I was part of a panel of code officials that discussed how we currently enforce the energy codes in our local jurisdiction and discussed some of the challenges that we are facing in code enforcement, the training of inspectors on the energy codes and where our states were in the process of adopting the most current codes.

Under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) in order for states to receive federal funding on energy related issues, state governors needed to notify the Secretary of Energy that the state or applicable units of local government will implement a plan for achieving compliance with the energy code. The two steps for the eligibility of funding are:

- 1. The state must implement energy codes of equal or greater stringency than the latest national model codes (currently, 2009 edition of the IECC and Standard 90.1-2007).
- 2. A plan to achieve 90% compliance of new renovated residential and commercial building space within 8 years of the enactment of the ARRA. This plan will include active training and enforcement programs and annual measurement of the rate of compliance.

The first step in this process will be handled by the Ohio Board of Building Standards. In December, a letter was sent out to all building departments informing the status of the current code adoption process. The second step has yet to be determined by the Department of Energy. It has been discussed that states and local governments will be audited on their plan review process, enforcement methods in the field and actual on-site inspections of on-going projects by the individuals given the task to audit the process.

The second step is currently being developed and it is not yet clear how the audit process will be implemented.

To inform the states on this program, the U.S. Department of Energy createdthe Building Energy Codes Program (BECP). This project was developed to aid state energy offices to provide technical assistance to help them adopt, upgrade, implement and enforce building energy codes. You can access this information at www.energycodes.gov. At this site, you can see where the different states are in the adoption process, learn about energy code compliance, and access downloads for RESCheck and COMCheck.
