There is a lot of news from the Ohio Building Officials Association (OBOA) this month. Most of you know from attending the conference that Mike Rudey, Wood County (Toledo area) Building Official, was elected to serve as OBOA's President for the next year. I enjoyed my term as president, but it is time for somebody else to take over now, and Mike will do everyone a good job in that position. The Dayton conference was a successful event thanks to all of you who attended. The latest count showed approximately 400 attendees to the conference, and the classes, the food and the events were all enjoyable.

The last OBOA board meeting was held at the Conference on Sunday, March 21st. Several items were discussed:

The OBOA web site has been down for several months and is now being redesigned in a new web language. It was infected with a virus back in October and never worked properly again after that time. Dan Sammon from the Miami Valley Building Officials group has donated his time to completely redesign the site, and it is starting to look very nice again. Please visit the new site at www.oboa.org to see the new information provided. One of the newest features is an interactive calendar that will include all of the educational offerings from around the state and the other code organizations as well as OBBS meetings and events. We owe Dan Sammon a vote of thanks for his fine work rebuilding this site.

The Columbus organization, which is COCOA, is again sponsoring a tailgate party for the scarlet and gray Ohio State football game which is being held on Saturday, April 24th. The tickets are cheap and are available through COCOA's web site at www.cocoa.org. The game draws upwards of 80,000 people and it is a great time and a great party. I have attended myself for the last three years and look forward to it every year. I hope to see some of our BOCONEO members at this year's event.

The next session of the Ohio Building Code Academy will be held from Monday, April 26th, through Friday, April 30th. There are only about 50 code officials registered for this session, so there is plenty of room for anyone that needs continuing education hours for one of your certifications. You can get as many as you want, from 2 or 4 hours up to as many as 35 or 36. The code academy is free of charge to attend, but you must pay for your own meals and lodging. It is held at the Quest Business Center at the Polaris exit off of I-71. Call the BBS at 614-644-2613 to make a reservation.

There isn't much going on code adoption-wise in the near future. A sub-committee of OBOA made up of a couple of architects and engineers developed a draft of some post-frame construction standards that were recently presented to the Residential Code Advisory Committee (RCAC) for inclusion into the next RCO. I will have the latest draft placed on our website for everyone's review and comment. Requirements for pole buildings would not be used for agricultural buildings, as they are exempt from the code. They would mainly be used for garages and other residential accessory buildings that are erected in that type of construction. Any adoptions of new codes in Ohio has been put on hold by executive order of the governor indefinitely. An informal word had it that the Energy Code might be adopted so that the State could accept some federal dollars for Energy Conservation, but I guess that we will all wait and see what happens.

The ICC spring hearings are in Dallas this spring, and no organizations that I know of are offering any compensation for anyone that attends. The annual (fall) meeting is in Charlotte N.C. this year, and the normal reimbursements will likely be made available at that time.


